

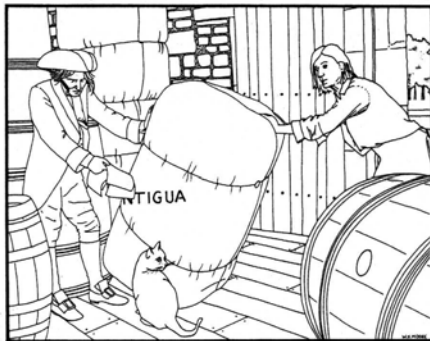

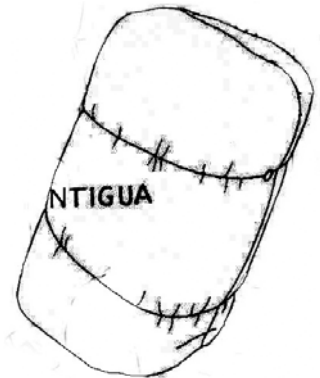
The Transportation of goods by ship.

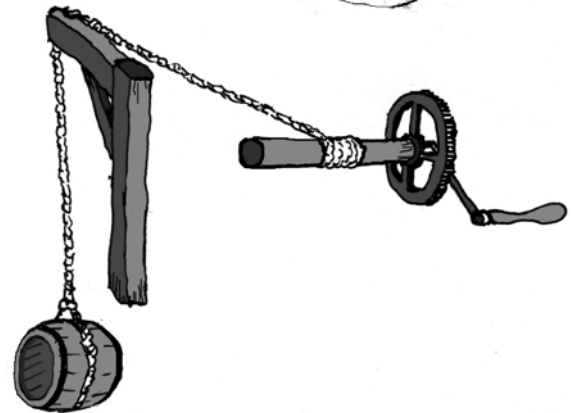

Transporting goods by sailing ship was a dangerous thing to do.

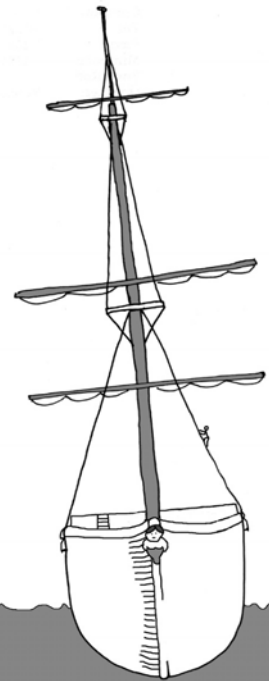
How could the weather affect the length of the journey?
