3. An inkpot and pen.

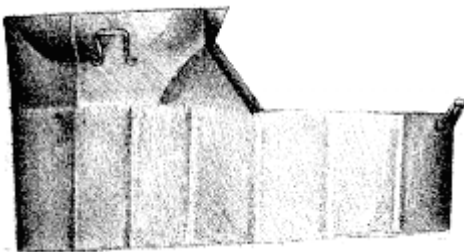
Trains were the fastest method of transport for the Victorians.
